

Widening Participation Project Summary of Feedback 24 Nov 2022

The Event

• This event brought together several FVC partners who are responsible for, and involved in, the transition of students to our college community – with a particular emphasis on those from widening participation (WP) backgrounds.

The event involved:

- Introduction to the purpose and aims of the Widening Participation Project (WPP).
- Facilitated discussion groups explored key themes around transition, using their experience to offer thoughts of improvements that could be made to enhance the transition process for students from WP backgrounds.
- Groups identified the risks and supports to a successful transition for future students from WP backgrounds, as well as suggesting the top 3 priorities for the focus of improvement.




Theme 2: Information Sharing

All in agreement that the sharing of relevant, proportionate and meaningful transition information is a critical part of enhancing a student's transition to college, and that it needs to be clear what processes are triggered once that information is shared to ensure that timely interventions can be implemented to support a successful transition

Theme 3: Timing

- Create a timeline/calendar detailing the critical points in the transition journey for future students as well as current applicants
- Tiered level of transition activities from S2 onwards
- Recognise that future students from WP backgrounds may need enhanced transition interventions which are actioned earlier in the calendar year and build this in






Theme 4: Preparedness for College Life


Actions to address **Theme 1: Support for Decision Making** will also benefit this theme.

- ✓ Ensure late applicants/enrolments (waiting lists) receive same level of support and information as other students
- ✓ Incorporate into system, process of following up on those students who miss first enrolment and induction activity.
- Phased distribution of prioritized precourse/induction information from preapplication/decision making to getting ready for your first day
- Timetables to be available much earlier (at least the days and times of the week) thereby setting expectations and allowing students to arrange their part time employment and/or childcare arrangements



- ✓ Incorporate social activities into induction activities for particular student groups
- ✓ Digital skills 'Get ready to learn' workshops (summer)
- ✓ Robust laptop loan policy and procedure so the student gets laptop on day 1 of college.

Theme 5: College Support to Succeed




Relevant policies and procedures to be considered include:
